It started with a call for help. "**We need food**." The Principal of one of our highest need schools— based on social-economic disparity— let us know that their breakfast program funding would not last until June. Students at that school rely heavily on the food support they receive— some eating only what is provided to them at school for the day. It was a serious situation, and as a result, the IDLF 'Cereal(ously)' campaign was born. Launched in May, DDSB staff and students quickly jumped to action to ensure that students had 'Full Bellies to Fuel Brains,' because it's hard to be successful in school when you are hungry.

Over 12 DDSB schools hosted food drives, and staff across the DDSB contributed to the campaign that raised almost \$7000.00 worth of breakfast and snack foods and over \$1400.00 in cash donations.

One Ajax school learned that giving to others in need can also be fun. They participated in a 'Cereal Box Domino Challenge' collecting over 300 boxes— enough to go around the entire school's main floor. Students gathered around to watch the 'Dominoes' fall as they celebrated their philanthropic efforts. One local Fire Department also got in on the action by collecting food at their hall and donating to our campaign.

We know that food insecurity is at an all-time high, and no longer restricted to our highest priority school communities. In the end, this campaign was not only able to give food support to the original school that reached out, but almost **SIXTY** additional schools across the region.

Glen Street Public School

The Oshawa Cobs Bread donations had a significant impact on our Glen Street school community the last few months of the 2022-2023 school year.

With the rising cost of food, many of our families were able to use these donations to create more wholesome lunches for their children. They could afford deli meat, cheese or jam and send their children with sandwiches. Our families used the bread, which are baked fresh daily with no added or preservatives, to supplement dinners by adding it as a side with soups or making grilled cheese.

Families that utilized our Cobs Bread program were families with insecure housing situations, families new to Canada and families that were newly created by adults in the community welcomed Glen students into their home. Whatever the situation was, our team in the office worked diligently to ensure the Cobs Bread Donations made it to those who needed it most. Our families were so thankful for the opportunity to subsidize their already tight grocery budgets with the help of Cobs Bread Oshawa.


